ACT is a licensed, 501(c)3 organization that was founded in 2001 with a mission to end killing as a means to control pet overpopulation in Hillsborough County. Currently, there are close to 23,500 cats and dogs destroyed at Animal Services because there are too many for the available homes.

That's 23,500 in one year

1,958 in one month

452 in one week

65 per day, if you don't take weekends off

2.7 an hour, if you stay up all night

One every 22 minutes.

*Every 22 minutes a dog or cat, or puppy or kitten gets a needle
that ends their life.*

In Hillsborough county. Our backyard. Our home.

That's not okay with us.

Lets work together to kill the problem, not the pets.

What it takes to end the killing:

Primarily, it takes a community of people who just won't accept it. The understanding that dead is dead and that killing is not okay. The determination to follow the lead of other communities that have solved the crisis. They all have several things in common, but it starts with the idea that killing the pets is just not okay.

The quickest way to start the process is to spay and neuter before the unwanted litters are produced.

Another is to keep the animals in their homes. To do that, affordable care, especially in our economic times, is imperative.
